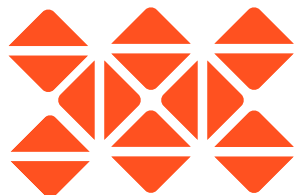
ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners must have a General Education and Training Certificate at NQF level 1, or an ABET level 4 qualification (equivalent of Grade 9 or Standard 7).

Learners who have achieved a Grade 10 School Leaving Certificate with English and Mathematics (Mathematical Literacy) will be exempted from the fundamental learning modules, through recognition of prior learning.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This qualification equips the learner with the skills, knowledge, and values to participate effectively in the Clothing Manufacturing Sector. It ensures that workers and new entrants acquire relevant skills and knowledge required by a fast-changing sector essential for economic growth. The learner will obtain a nationally recognised qualification in Clothing Manufacturing processes at NQF Level 2.

- Manual processes in the Cutting Room
- Demonstrate an ability to perform manual processes in the cutting room.

- Demonstrate an ability to design and make patterns for sewn products
